### Required project using one book you read over summer:

Create a **new** book cover for your book, using an 8 x 11 piece of computer paper. Be sure to include the title and author. Inside the cover, divide the page into four equal sections. In the top left corner, write a paragraph about the setting of the story. In the top right corner, write a paragraph about the main characters in the story. In the bottom left corner, write a paragraph about the problem or conflict that needed to be solved in the story. In the bottom right corner, draw and color your favorite scene from the story. On the back of the paper, write a paragraph telling what you liked about the book and if you would recommend it to a friend, and why or why not. This should be turned in within the first week of school.
